About the Seminar cum Webinar

Today we are living in the era of technology, human society is undergoing complete metamorphosis in the present situation. The 20th century has been marked as century of rational thinking and experienced many radical changes in the fundamental institutions across the globe. Ushering to 21st century and subsequently the development of the first two decades of this century is notable and the whole world witnessed and encountered with many changes. Sociology being a science of society has responsibility to analyse, actively address and document these changes by looking backward at our discipline over the twentieth century and of thinking about moving forward in the twenty-first. The recount of individuals' quest for control basic institutions particular in context of their moral status is being threatened. The sociological reality reflects in the rules for such renderings, contain an inner logic, and make moral claims for credibility.

While looking *backward* at the discipline, sociologists need to build on the classical theories, not dismiss them. At the millennium sociological theory and methods are contested; and challenges to foundational assumptions that gained momentum in the late 1960s have recently been raised anew. Moving forward in the *twenty-first century means recommitting ourselves to empirical inquiry and resting our moral claims on it*. Acknowledging the diversity of sociological approaches, agreeing on strong standards for each approach, and recognizing and examining our disciplinary moral claims over the changes we are experiencing and trying to understand and document them is a big responsibility on the shoulders of sociologists.

To understand basic institutional changes happening in the recent time of global pandemic COVID-19 has created an opportunity to expand the horizons of sociological knowledge. Speaking specifically, even before the COVID-19, the fundamental social institutions like marriage, family, kinship and others had experienced drastic changes and presently facing lot of problems and struggling with the existence of their traditional nature. Changes in fundamental social institutions have created a situation as well as an opportunity for sociologists to understand and document the threats, issues and challenges and find workable solution/s by using scientific sociological understanding.

The present seminar cum webinar is an attempt to provide a platform to the researchers/scholars/teachers /NGOs/CBOs to discuss and share their understanding of institutional changes. In this seminar -cum -webinar format, the scholar will be given an opportunity to present their work by using both formats; **online as well as offline**.
